Biographical Sketch

Jūratė Kazickas was born on February 18, 1943. Fleeing the Soviet Army, Kazickas and her family left Lithuania in 1944 to seek safety in Germany. After about three years in different displaced persons camps, the Kazickas family finally found refuge in the United States. There Kazickas graduated from Trinity College in Washington, D.C. Working as a journalist, Kazickas covered the Vietnam War, the Middle East and the Carter White House. She has also co-authored books such as *Susan B. Anthony Slept Here* and *War Torn: Stories of War from the Women Reporters Who Covered Vietnam*. Currently, Kazickas is involved in work related to refugees.
